

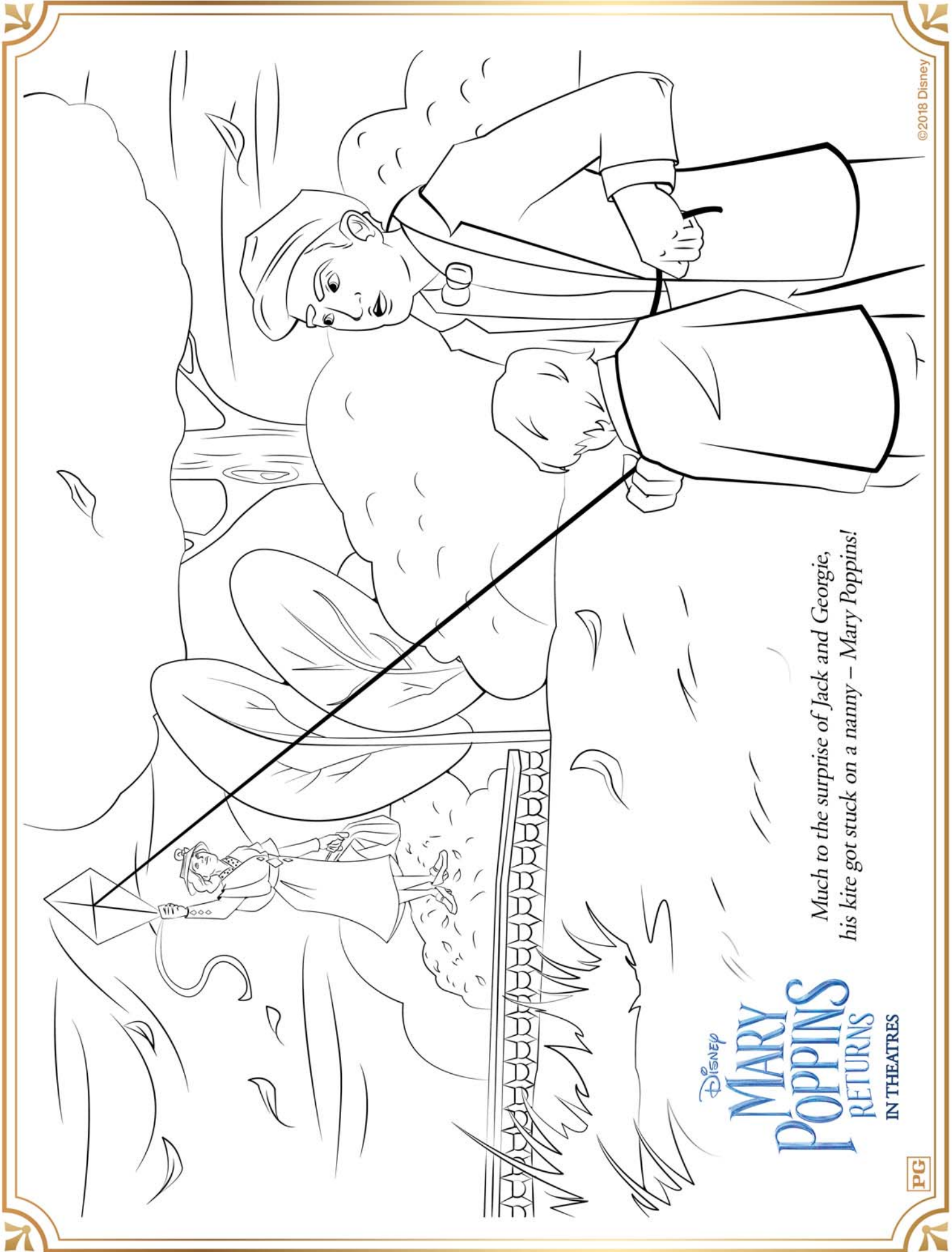

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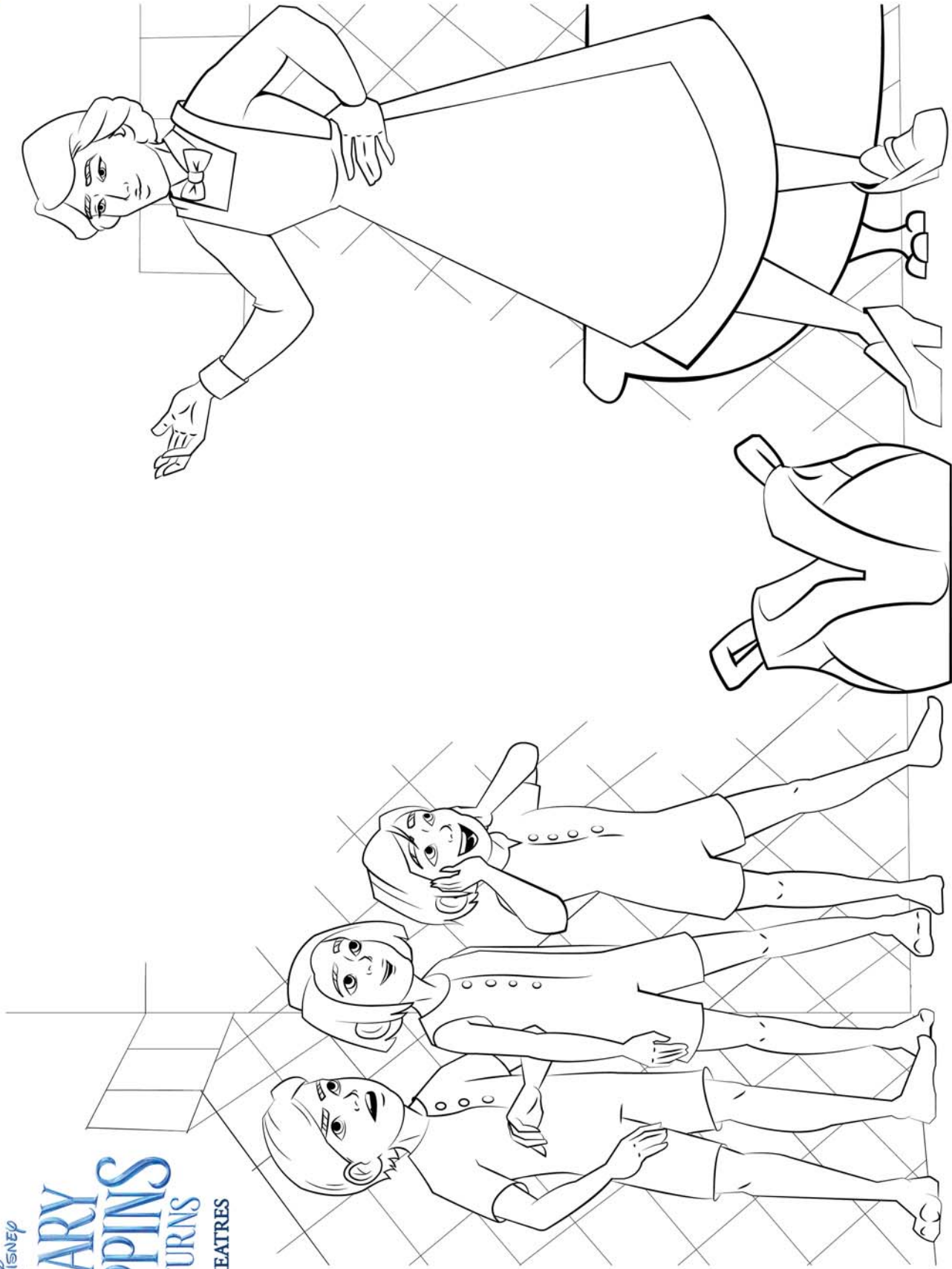
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*Much to the surprise of Jack and Georgie,

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Mary Poppins can pull anything out of her bag. Can you imagine that? Draw in what you think she's just pulled out.

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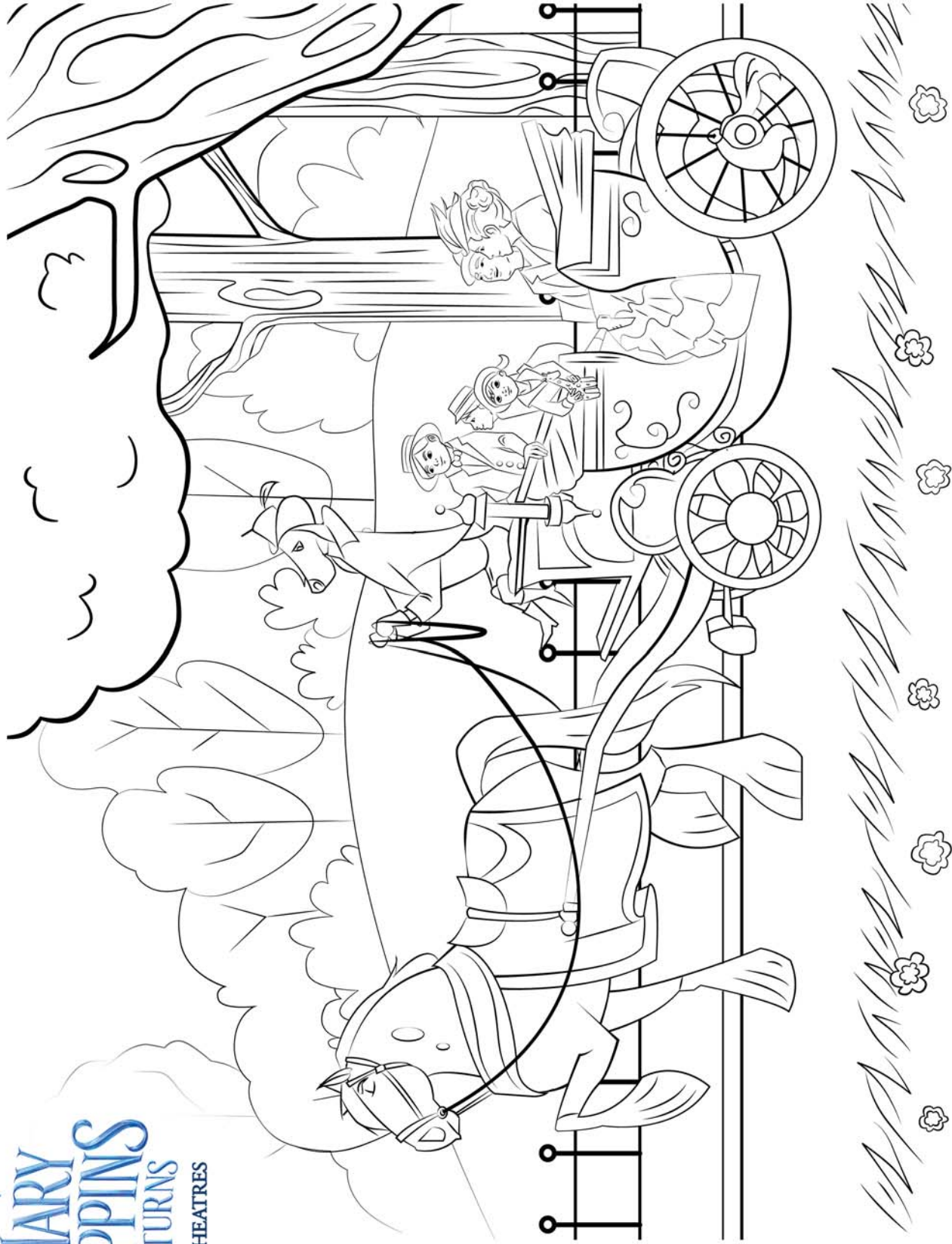


Taking a bath has never been so much fun!

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In the porcelain world of a china bowl, Mary Poppins takes Jack and the kids on a magical carriage ride.

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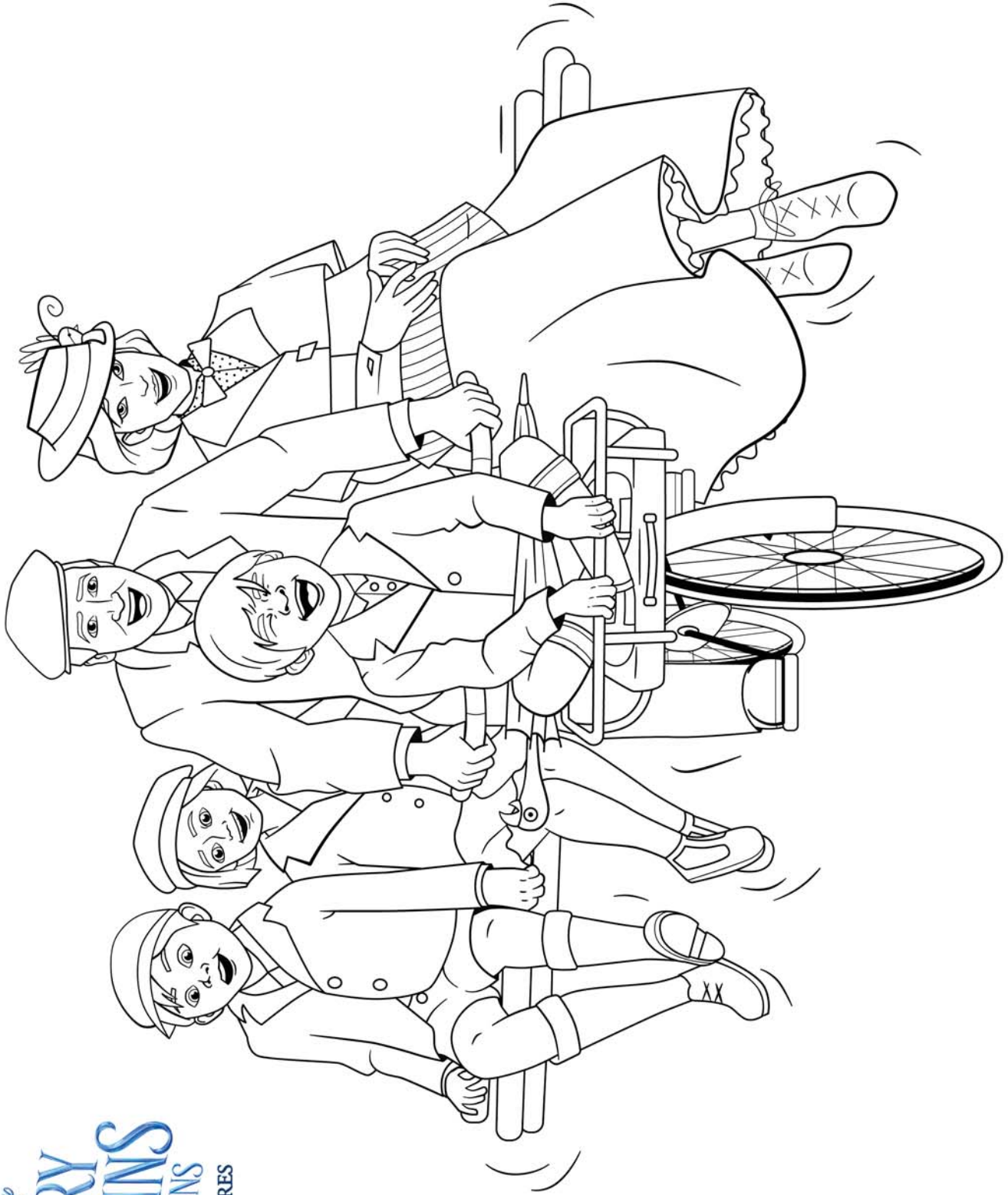
*At the Royal Doulton Music Hall, the entertainers for
the big show are none other than Jack and Mary Poppins!*



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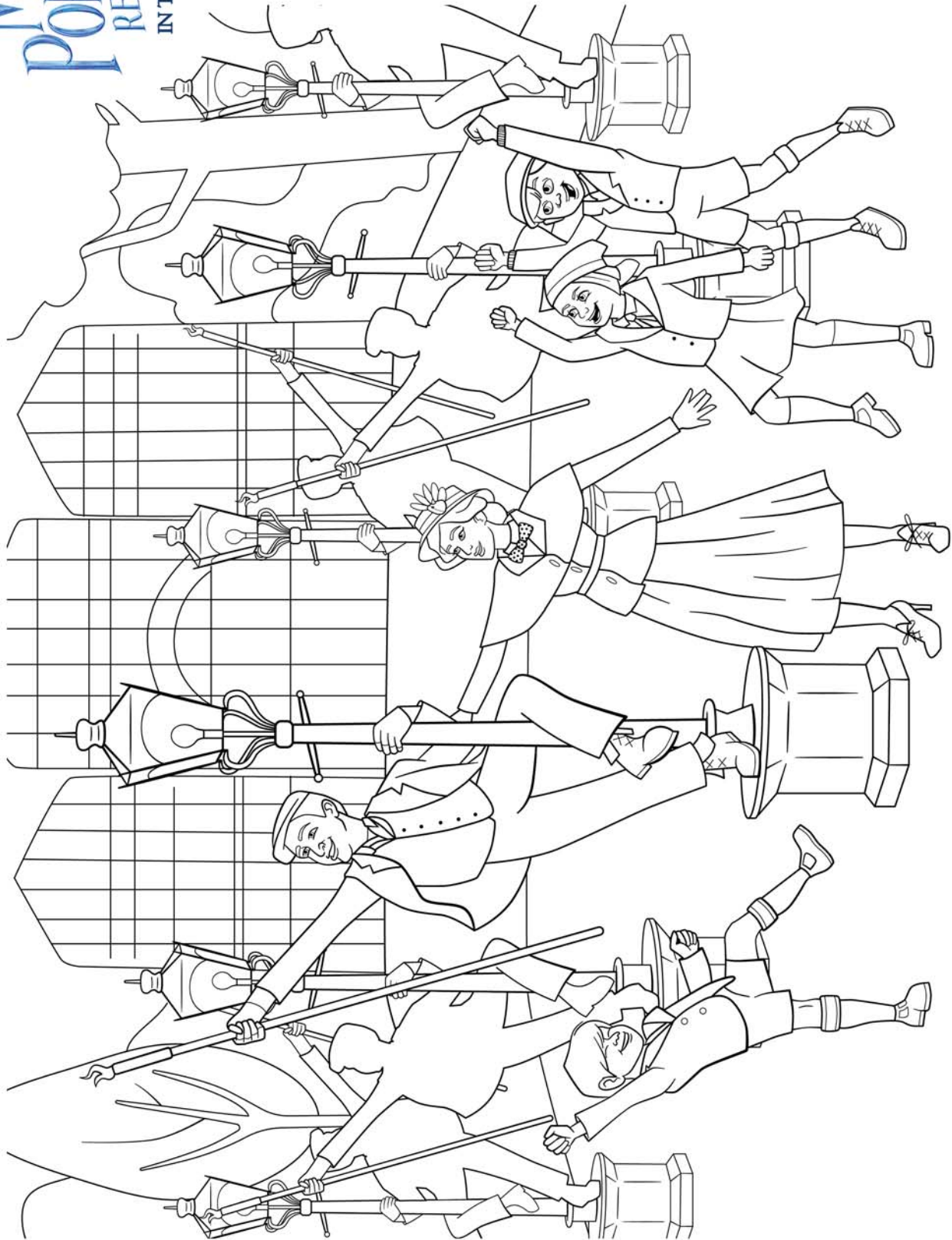


Even riding on a bicycle is more fun with Mary Poppins!

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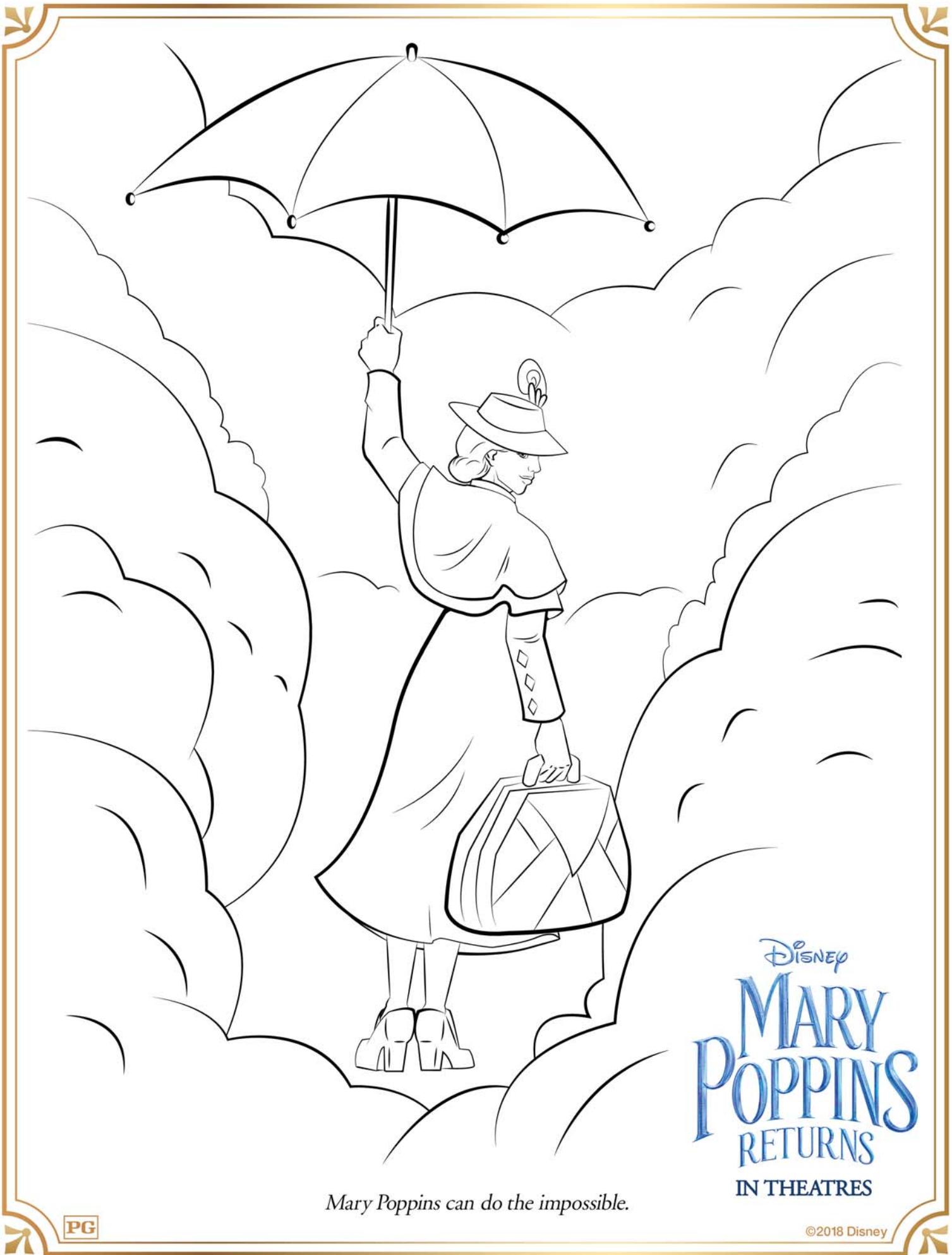
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Jack and the Lamplighters show Mary Poppins and the children how to trip a little light fantastic!

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A Cover Is Not The Book(marks)

Have an adult help print this page out on heavy paper and cut along the dashed lines. Use a straight-edge to help fold each bookmark down the center. Insure the two sides fold together cleanly before gluing together.



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Underneath The Lovely London Sky: Let's go fly a kite!

What you'll need:

2 sticks (1 20in, 1 24in), String, Glue, Tape, Scissors,
Paper (or plastic garbage bag) 40in wide.

Step 1: Make the frame

- Take the two sticks and put them across each other so that you create a lowercase t-shape. Attach the sticks together with glue.
- Wrap the string around the sticks and tie with a small knot. Trim off excess string with scissors.
- Make 1 notch at the end of each stick. Make sure they are horizontal to the t-shape of the sticks.
- Loop the string around the top notch, then pull it to the end of the stick to the right, wrap around that notch, and continue until you've wrapped all four notches and the string makes a diamond shape. Make sure the string is taut but not too tight.

Step 2: Making the sail

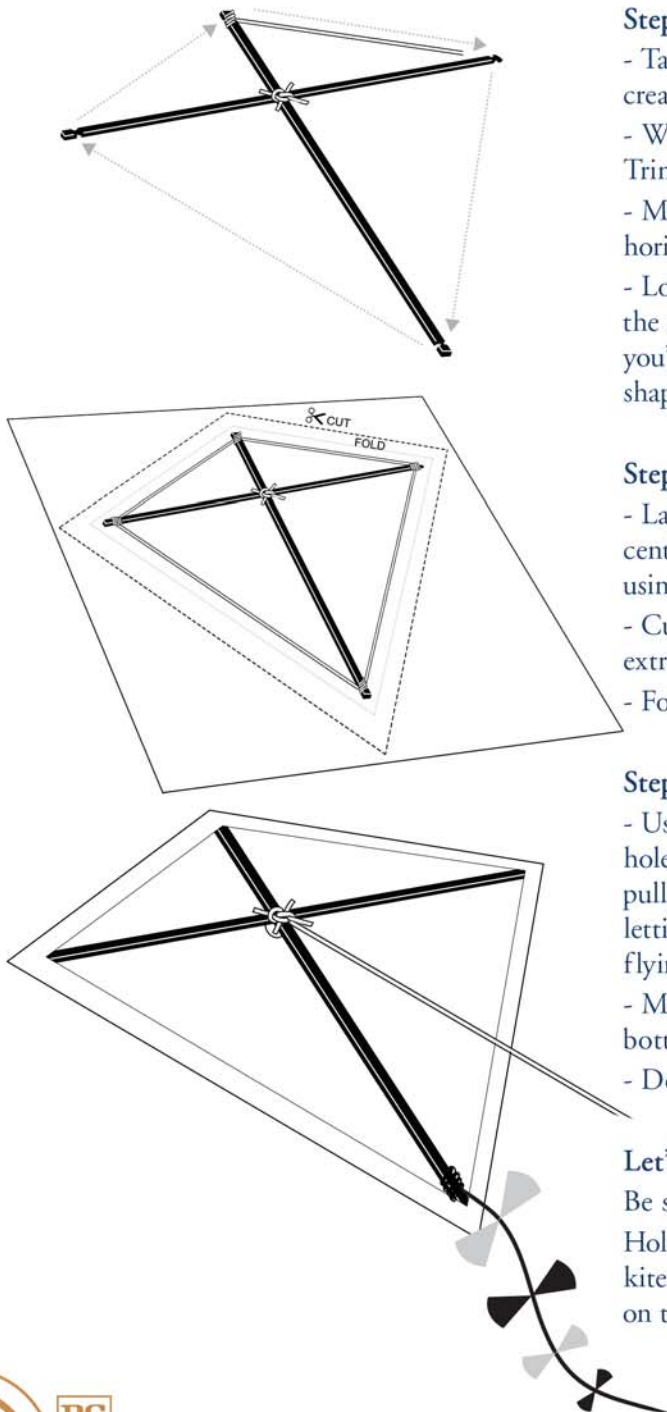
- Lay the paper (or plastic bag) flat and place the frame on the center of it. Using a pen or pencil, outline the frame with a ruler using the strings as a guide, creating a diamond shape
- Cut the diamond 2in wider than the outline (you'll need the extra material so you can wrap the sail around the frame.)
- Fold the edges of the sail over the frame. Glue and tape it down.

Step 3: Putting it all together

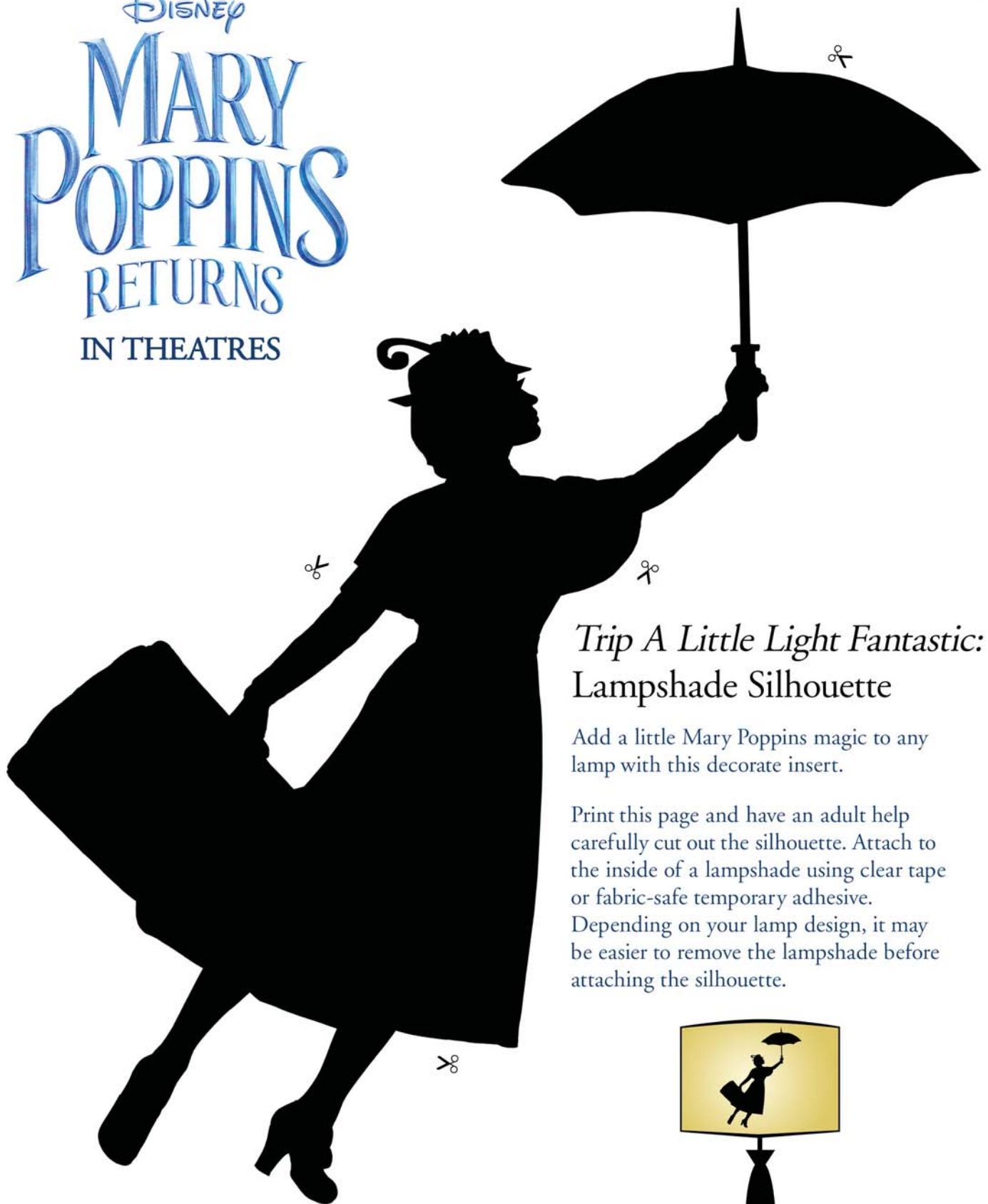
- Use a string that is at least 2in for the flying line. Poke a small hole right above where the two sticks meet in the center. Then pull the string through the hole and tie it around the cross point, letting the flying line hang freely. You can add more string to the flying line to make it longer.
- Make a tail with 6ft string or cloth. Attach the tail to the bottom of the frame at 1ft intervals.
- Decorate your kite!

Let's go fly a kite!

Be sure to take your kite to a spot with no trees or power lines. Hold tight to the kite string and run into the wind. Release the kite as you are running, pushing it upward into the wind. Hang on to your flying line to keep the kite in the air.



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Trip A Little Light Fantastic:
Lampshade Silhouette

Add a little Mary Poppins magic to any lamp with this decorate insert.

Print this page and have an adult help carefully cut out the silhouette. Attach to the inside of a lampshade using clear tape or fabric-safe temporary adhesive.

Depending on your lamp design, it may be easier to remove the lampshade before attaching the silhouette.



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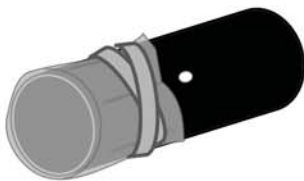
Make Your Own Musical Instruments

If you're ever going to play at the **Royal Dulton Music Hall**, you're going to need to practice, but first, you'll need an instrument. Did you know that you can make your own instrument from things already in your house? Here are just a few ideas, but be creative and you might surprise even yourself.



Drum

Take a bucket, pot or box to use as a drum. Turn it upside down so that the open end is on the floor. Use pencils or wooden spoons as drumsticks. They're waiting for your big drum roll!



Kazoo

What you'll need: Old toilet paper or paper towel roll, wax paper, rubber band, sharp pencil, art supplies for decoration

Take your cardboard tube and put wax paper on one end of it, securing it with a rubber band. Use a sharp pencil to poke a hole in the side of the cardboard tube. Put the open end up to your mouth and hum to make a kazoo sound. Use your art supplies to decorate to your liking, and now you've got a lavish, praisable kazoo!



Glass Harp

There's quite another world upon your shelf and with a few glasses of water, you're on the brink of a musical adventure.

What you'll need: 8 water glasses, 1 plastic spoon, 1 set of measuring cups
Place the glasses in a line and fill them up with different amounts of water. Start with 1/8 cup of water in the first one, then put 1/8 cup of water more than the next glass. Use a plastic spoon (not a wooden or metal one) to avoid breaking or chipping the glasses. Tap the glasses with the plastic spoon and notice how each glass makes a different note!



Rubber-Band Guitar

There are lots of cats tuning strings, and you can join them with these simple household things.

What you'll need: empty tissue box, empty paper towel roll, 4 rubber bands, 2 popsicle sticks

Remove the clear plastic from inside the hole in the tissue box. Attach the paper towel roll to the tissue box using tape or glue. Decorate your guitar however you like to make it dilly dynamical. You can paint it or cover it with paper. Now glue down popsicle sticks above and below the hole to make the "bridge". Once the glue is dry, wrap four large rubber bands around the box lengthwise. Use thick and thin rubber bands for different sounds. Now you're ready for your standing ovation!
