Ruby Bridges
Ruby Bridges was born in 1954 in Mississippi. She had 5 siblings
and her parents were farmers. In 1956, Ruby and her family moved
to New Orleans, Louisiana looking for better work.
Many Southern states still had segregated schools even though
the U.S. Supreme Court had made a ruling that ended segregation in
schools.
In 1959, Ruby attended an all-black kindergarten. The following
year, the government mandated that Louisiana desegregate its
schools. So the school system created an entrance exam for all
African American students to take. Ruby and five other students
passed the exam!

Her parents were split about sending Ruby to the all-white school but decided to go ahead so that Ruby would have the same educational opportunities. Ruby and her mother were escorted by federal marshalls every day that year to school. Some people were very upset that Ruby was allowed to attend that school.

Ruby graduated from a desegrated high school and became a travel agent. She has been active in equal rights ever since and is still alive today.
